# LEARNING THIS WEEK IN CLASSES

Each week we will let you know about some of the learning in class so you can talk about this with your child. All children have begun a new class reading book this week. Ask them about this and what has happened so far.

Class	Learning
Nursery	We have carved pumpkins and built castles!   Image: Constraint of the second se
Peach and Rowan	We have been to the Scrubs with our parents again and practised our different sounds. Ask me which ones I have learnt this week!
Olive	We have been estimating numbers on a number line and explaining why we have made this estimation.
Maple	We are subtracting using number bonds up to 20.
Hazel	We have been adding adjectives to sentences to make them even better and adding two 2-digit numbers
Laurel	We have been counting in repeated steps of 3 and 4, and begun reading The Tales of Wisdom and Wonder
Magnolia	We have been looking at the story <i>The White Rat</i> and finding 10/100/1000 more and less than a given number
Sycamore	We have been counting in 6, 7 and 9s and retelling the story <i>The White Rat</i>
Willow and Elm	We have been writing a chapter of the story Odysseus and practised problems with addition and subtraction
Hawthorn and	We have been practising dividing larger numbers and prepared an
Plum	introduction to a balanced argument.
