The lunch last Sunday at the community centre was fantastic and it was lovely to see so many children and families at the event. The Old Oak Bubble and Squeak children represented the school really well and impressed everyone with the way they spoke and behaved.

I hope your child has a reading book they are enjoying at home, either with you or independently. I have said before that reading is the single most important thing that can support your child at school in all subjects. It also helps children to develop their vocabulary and the number of words they can use. A poor or limited vocabulary is a real barrier to your child's progress. You can help them by making sure they read every night!



Finally, I showed a visitor around on Wednesday afternoon, and we were both impressed with the amount of music going on in classes just before

the end of the day. Year 6 were drumming in the upstairs hall, Year 3 were playing the recorders and the choir were practising in the music room. The Royal College of Music students had just left the school after working with the reception children! All of this provision is still taught by specialists, is free to all children and for me, remains a big part of life at the school. However, if you would like your child to learn an instrument after school and pay for the tuition, this can also be arranged.

*Finally, please check the lost property if your child has lost school uniform. I counted 16 Old Oak sweatshirts, 3 cardigans, 4 fleeces and 3 rucksacks in the key stage 2 lost property alone. There were also at least 9 coats in there as well!*

### **ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL**

If your child is not in school, you must call and let us know. If you do not, WE WILL CALL YOU TO FIND OUT WHY. We have a duty of care to your child to do this. If we cannot contact you, the absence will be unauthorised. #### PUNCTUALITY

School starts at 8.55am. For Nursery and Reception parents and children, the gates are open until

9.05am to allow parents to get an older child to another gate beforehand. We then close the Nursery and Reception gate and staff settle the children and begin the day. If you are late, please wait in the main reception area until 9.25am, when your child will be collected by a member of staff. The mornings are very busy in the Early Years and it is not possible for a member of staff to keep opening the gate for children who are late.

### **CLUBS**

Look out for the invitations to the clubs on Monday. Some of the clubs were very popular and we will have to choose the children by lottery on this occasion as the groups cannot be too big. If your child is not successful this time round, then they will be put on the waiting list for next term. The clubs will start next week and run on 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> October and 7<sup>th</sup> November from 3.15-4.15pm.
