Laurel	We have been practising addition and subtraction and reading the story
	"The Blind Man and the Hunter".
Magnolia	We have been looking traditional tales and can count in multiples of
	25/1000 or 50/100

Sycamore	We have been classifying materials in IPC and reading the story "The Blind Man and the Hunter".
Willow and Elm	We have prepared a debate in Elm class and in Willow we have started our work on the Power of Pictures. In IPC we have looked at a Roman villa.
Hawthorn and Plum	We have used long division to solve arithmetic and worded problems and completed our very impressive balanced arguments.
