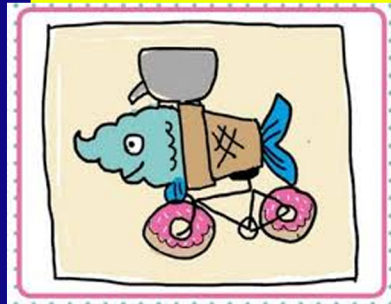
Your Task:

Think of one of the best dreams you have had, the stranger the better. Maybe your dream is a combination of things which happen in reality but have been slightly distorted or changed in some way. When I think of something surreal I think of Alice in Wonderland and the images which come into my mind when I read the story.

You are going to draw and paint your own 'Dreamscape' surrealist painting.

- *Remember all the skills you have learnt throughout the year.
- *Sketch out your idea first
- *Try not to use a rubber, if you sketch lightly you will not need one
- *Once you are happy with your sketching you can add more details with darker lines
- *If you can find some references from magazines, your reading books, online (an adult must be with you) that is even better. Drawing from a direct reference is the best way to increase your skill
- *Finally paint, remembering the colour wheel and blending your paints to create tones.
- *Add white paint to make a colour lighter or black to make a colour darker, add in very small quantities

Have a look at some examples of other children's surrealist pieces. These may give you some inspiration also
