WORMWOOD SCRUBS PLAYPARK OPENING



On Tuesday afternoon, members of the Pupil Council and 'Positive Change' officially opened the new playpark in Wormwood Scrubs. 'Positive Change' are a group of children who have worked with Citizens UK and West London Zone to make positive changes in the local area. The group had the idea of improving the scrubs and wrote to local councillors asking for support. They were successful in securing funding for the new zip line and trampoline and now the park is ready for everyone to enjoy. The official opening was attended by local councillors, contractors and many other significant people from the local area. OLD OAK SCIENCE WEEK

Next week we will be celebrating British Science Week 2023. The focus for Old Oak Science Week is 'Living Things'. Each class will have a different animal focus including fish, minibeasts, mammals, birds and humans. To engage and excite the children about their Science learning, we are lucky enough to have a variety of visitors (both human and non - human) coming into school. On Monday, Chester and Mabel (our canine friends) will be visiting Years 3 and 4 to understand that features of mammals. On Tuesday, the company Zoolab will be bringing in a variety of animals for the children to observe and learn about. There will also be representatives from WellHome, Royal Society for the Protection of Birds (RSPB), Urbanwise and Imperial College leading sessions with different classes. For Year 4 and Year 5, this will mean trips across to the scrubs to build shelters for mammals or bird watch with the RSPB. There is such a good range of activities this year, we hope the children will come away from Science Week with a real enthusiasm for the subject. Many thanks to all our school partners for supporting us with this, and to Ms. Crane and Ms. Khalil for organising the week.

FRIDAY 17th MARCH - RED NOSE DAY

On Friday 17th March, we encourage children to wear red spots and bring a donation to charity to celebrate Red Nose Day.
