Do you know what my job is? It might surprise you, but I have been a detective, a dancer, a dragon, and an astronaut. Just by reading a book I have become so many characters and I have had so many adventures.

Children's author Malorie Blackman once said that she would never have become an author if she didn't visit her local library as a child.

Another children's author David Walliams said 'I used to go to the library every

couple of weeks with my mum and dad and get out books like 'Stig of the Dump' and 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory.' The author added: "My son is five and a half, and when we read together, it's the most magical time."

In our libraries you can borrow books, audio books, you can learn a language like Spanish, we have under 5's sessions where children hear stories and sing along to nursery rhymes.
