#### \*MATHS WORKSHOPS FOR PARENTS\*

Thank you to those parents who found time to attend the maths workshops for parents. These are held for you to understand better how to support your child at home. Please ask if you need support with the mathematics and your child.

#### \*TEACHERS - WEDNESDSAY 1st INDUSTRIAL ACTION\*

Unless you have heard otherwise, the school is closed for children on Wednesday, 1<sup>st</sup> February next week. This is due to the members of the National Education Union striking over a number of issues. These are:

- the funding for schools
- the insufficient pay increases
- the recruitment and retention of teachers- keeping teachers in the profession

Please recognise that the teachers have not taken this decision lightly and we hope that school funding will improve in the future.

### \*COMING TO SCHOOL\*

There are a small number of families and their children who have very poor attendance (between 70-85%) and they are pulling down

the school's overall attendance percentage. This is a problem for us as the school is judged on this. We will contact families next week for a meeting where we look for solutions and improvement. This may involve Mr. Anwar Raihani, The Hammersmith & Fulham School Attendance Support Officer. It is possible in the future to use penalty notices to solve poor attendance but would hope that we can collaborate to avoid this.

#### \*ROYAL INSTITUTE MASTERCLASSES - MATHEMATICS\*

Three of our year 5 pupils have been lucky enough to be nominated to participate in The Royal Institute Masterclasses. These are a series of workshops which are led by maths enthusiasts from industry, academia and education. The Masterclasses aim to inspire young people in the beauty and wonder of mathematics and to develop a sense of enjoyment in the subject. They offer pupils indepth investigations of topics in mathematics from beyond the normal primary curriculum. The three children enjoyed the puzzles they were challenged with during the first session last week. They were also suitably in awe of the impressive RI building – particularly the library!

#### \*SEESAW\*

The school uses the Seesaw app to assign homework and communicate with families. Seesaw has improved the homework provision we provide as activities can be assigned per individual child, other adults working with children can view and comment on their work, it allows for a variety of multimedia to be used and communication between home and school is quicker and more efficient. It is also far better for the environment and prepares the children for our technologically advanced world. It is the expectation that all pupils complete the tasks set on Seesaw. They can either do this directly on the app, or complete on paper and send the teacher a photograph of their achievements.
