Dear families,

We hope you have had a good week. The children receive daily assemblies here at Old Oak. We have spent time in assemblies talking about our school values which underpin everything we do here at Old Oak. We have focussed on communication in assembly this week. You can always ask your children on a Monday what we talked about and continue the discussions at home.

On a Tuesday the children receive a music assembly- we listen to a different piece of music every week and discuss the genre and period of history the music originated. We try to develop the children's musical taste and talk a lot about preferences. We also talk about how the music made them feel and try and listen for which instruments we can hear. See if your child can remember what they listened to! We enjoy singing together and this week have chosen a new song to learn.

Wednesday assemblies are classes' time to shine as you know and we are always grateful for your support. Thursday- the children have a class assembly which focuses on the school's values and which ones the children have shown, children receive praise for being nominated. Friday is a chance for every child throughout the term to share their learning with the rest of the school. Every week we will inform you of what each class chose to share, please see below.

SHARING ASSEMBLY UPDATE:

We enjoyed a range of different curriculum areas today in our Sharing assembly.

If you child is in **Peach** class, please ask them about the **owl paintings** they have done in class.

In **Olive and Acacia class**, ask them about the lovely **writing** they have been doing on their IPC topic.







In **Chestnut**, they may be able to describe the **3 different types of rock** that we have in the world, and in **Magnolia** all about their **experiment** with materials.

Aspen class wrote a text based on the struggle of the Suffragettes and Willow class should be able to explain about adding fractions. We all enjoyed the children coming forward and sharing their work with the whole school – English, maths, IPC Science and Art this week. They should all feel very proud of their achievements.

While we were doing the sharing assembly, **Golden Sunburst** were enjoying a walk around the local area.
