





Old Oak Primary School Update Friday, 27th September 2024

Dear families,

Thank you to those parents who attended the Meet the Teacher sessions this week. We hope you found them useful. It is helpful for you to see the classroom as well and to understand the environment where the children spend their days. The partnership between school and home is so important and your support is really appreciated.

We have written below about the importance of reading at home every day and the impact this has on children's progress. We also have some information below about the events at our local Shepherds Bush library, including meeting an author this Saturday morning.

Attendance - OUR TARGET IS 96% FOR THE SCHOOL

The new government is very keen to improve attendance in schools. The 2024 document states that:

'Where parents decide to have their child registered at school, they have an additional **legal duty** to ensure their child attends that school regularly. This means their child **must** attend every day that the school is open, except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school.'

The attendance figures for the top classes is good again this week. In key stage 1, Acacia Class achieved 96%, and in key stage 2, Willow class achieved 97%. This is

exactly what your children need- to be in school as often as possible. Well done to those classes.

<u>Punctuality</u> – Acacia class also had the best punctuality in key stage 1, with 6 late children. In key stage 2, Magnolia class also had 6.

<u>Reading with children at home:</u> We often talk about the importance of reading at home in our updates. But read the research below about the long term benefits of reading at home from the Booktrust:

A child growing up in poverty who is read to at age five has a **significantly higher chance of economic success** in their 30s than their peers who are not read to.

Shared reading has a unique and transformative impact on school attainment. Shared reading at home exerts a stronger influence on children's academic performance than parents' supervision, control of homework or attendance of school activities.




