Dear families,

It was 'Wear Your SCARF Day' today for Children's Mental Health. Everyone wore a scarf as a symbol of support for children's mental wellbeing, while celebrating the values of SCARF - Safety, Caring, Achievement, Resilience and Friendship. SCARF is part of our partners at Coram Life Education. In school we have talked about mental health and well-being in assemblies and in classes throughout this week. Old Oak already tries to focus on the well-being and happiness of children at all times but it is important to be able to really draw special attention to this. Please talk to your children about what today meant to them.

Next Tuesday, Year 4 will be involved in the press launch for Allergy Schools programme. The children were involved in filming for the resources to promote allergy awareness with young people last year, and the charity, Natasha Allergy Research Foundation, are returning to us for the launch. This may feature on the news later in the day. We will let you know how it goes.


