






Tie-Dye Drama have kindly donated a workshop for the Year 1 children. It will be based on the traditional West African folk tale of The Leopard's Drum.



The English Chamber Orchestra will be working for a full day with the Year 4 children. They will be sharing the music of Chevalier de Saint-Georges.




