Maths

This term we will be learning about:

- Place value including decimals;
- Numbers up to 3 decimal places (reading, writing, ordering and comparing);
- -Written addition and subtraction problems (including multi-step problems);
- -Mental x and ÷ (including factors and multiples)
- -Written methods for multiplication;
- -Written methods for division:
- Angles (measuring in degrees, estimating and comparing acute, obtuse and reflex angles, using a protractor);
- -Area and perimeter of shapes;
- -Fractions (comparing, ordering and equivalence)
- -Reading analogue and digital clocks
- -Solving time problems including timetables
- learning to read and interpret Statistics in different forms.

English

English Poetry

In the first half term we will be reading the poetry book 'Werewolf Club Rules' by Joseph Coelho. This collection of poems covers themes of school and family life. The poems will be used as a way of exploring personal storytelling, emotional responses and the use of language to describe settings.

Key skills include:

- Interpreting poems for performance
- Using art as a response to a poem
- Recognizing figurative language and its effect on the reader
- Drafting and composing own poems

In the second half of the term we will be studying 'Odysseus' which links in with our IPC topic.

GRAMMAR and PUNCTUATION

Revise the different word types: noun, verb, adjectives, adverbs, co-ordinating conjunction, subordinating conjunction, prepositions, determiners, pronouns and possessive pronouns.

Use fronted adverbials and noun phrases to make our writing more interesting,

SPELLING: Words with endings that sound like /shuhs/ spelt with -tious or - ious -cious, short vowel sounds
